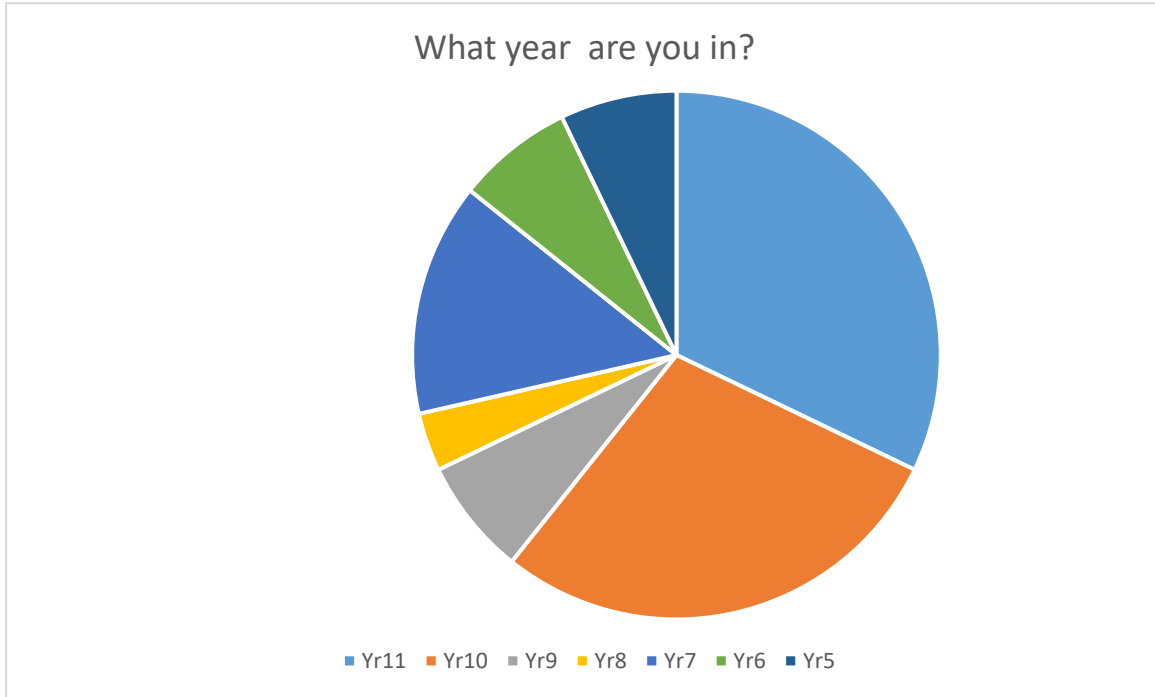


## Maple Pupil Reading Survey – November 2022

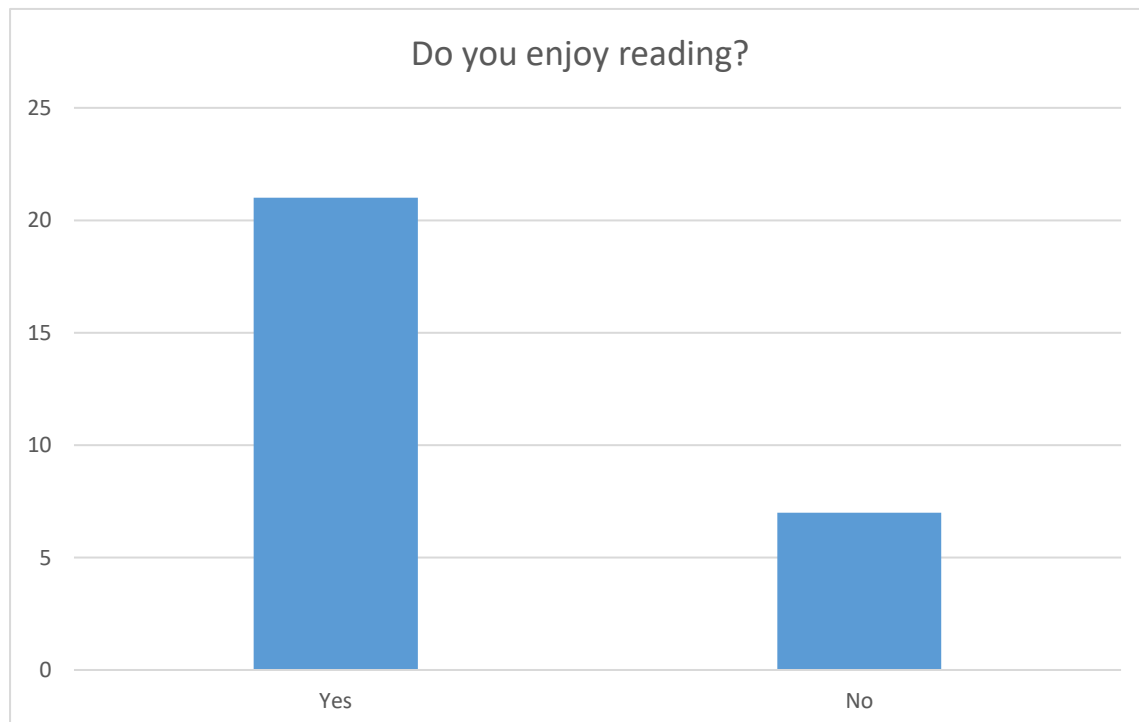
We surveyed our pupils about reading and had 28 responses. The following are the results of the survey.

Most pupils were in KS4

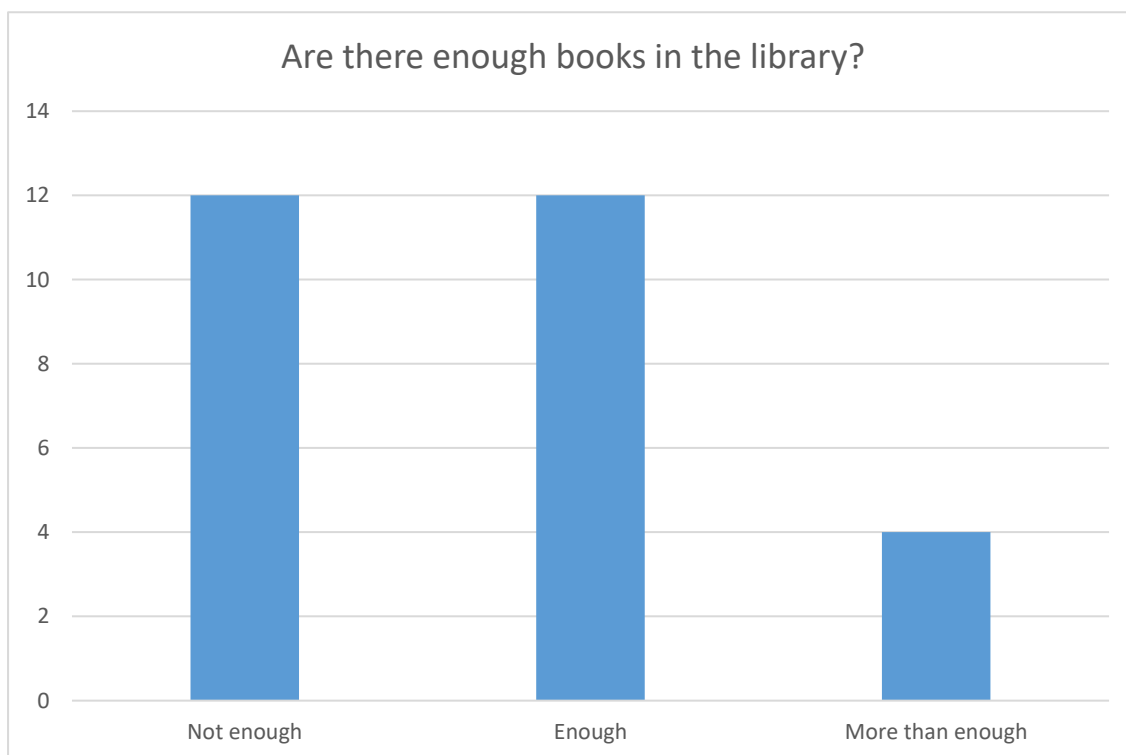

3. For this question, we asked what book they are reading at the moment. These are the responses;

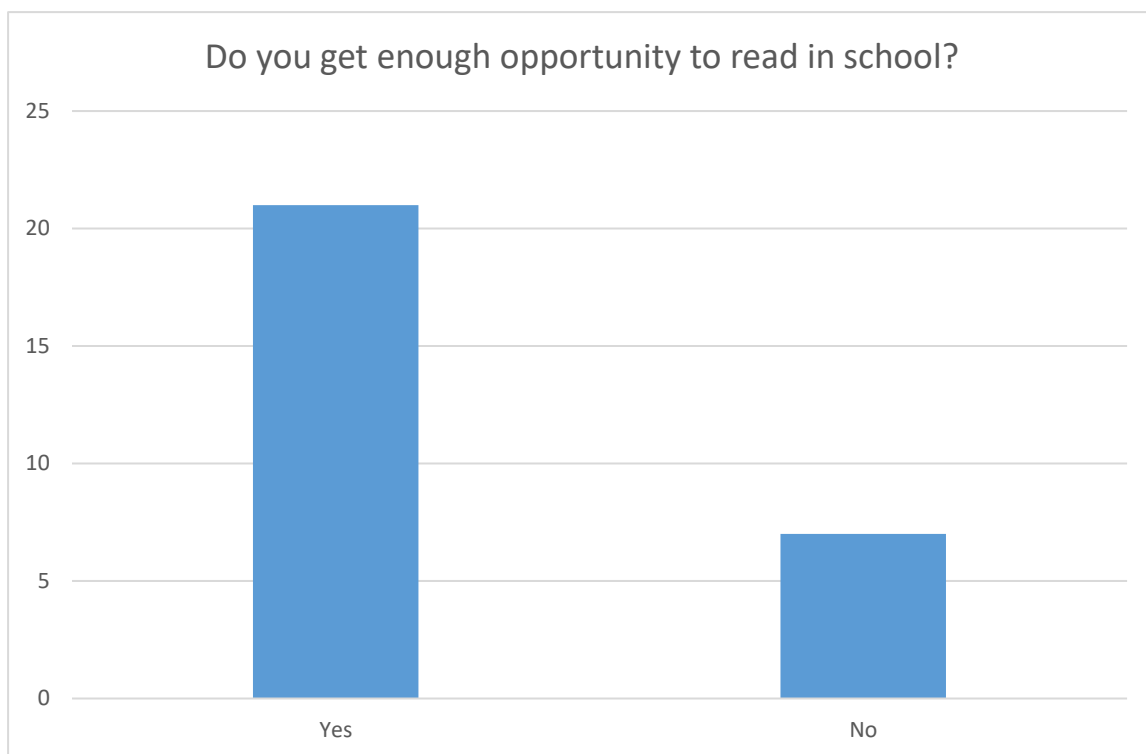
Gangster Granny, The Snail on the Whale, Dinosaurs in Underpants, The Christmasaurus, Stargazing World, All the Young Dudes, Horrid Henry, Young Sherlock Holmes, Anna dressed in Blood, The Poisoned Garden, The Boy in the Tower, Tess is a Mess, Cookie's Christmas Invention, The Shopping List, A Mouse Called Wolf, Diary of a Wimpy Kid, Grandpa's Great Escape, Stargazing for Beginners, We Both Die at the End and High School DXD. 7 pupils are not reading anything at the moment.

12 out of the 28 pupils surveyed said that there were not enough books in the library. We have discussed this at student council and student council members will be asking their peers which books they would like to see. We have already identified gaps such as nonfiction and graphic novels. We will be using student council money to pay for these.

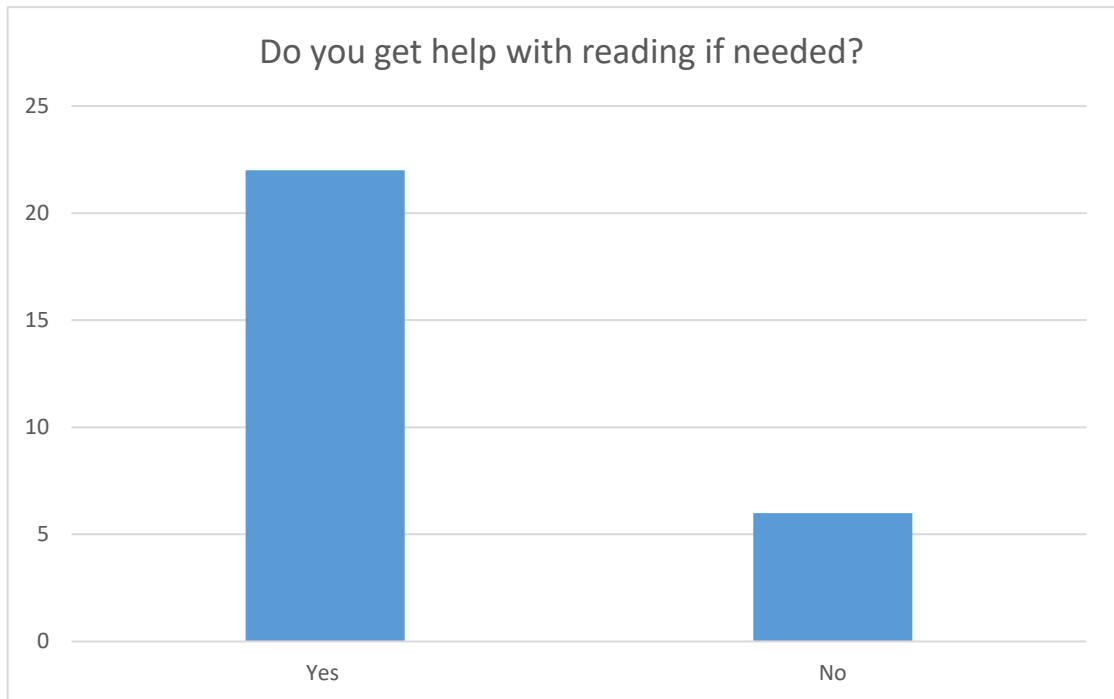


Most pupils felt there was enough opportunity to read in school. Most lessons have opportunities to read. We will discuss a possible book club at student council.

6. We asked pupils what other books they would like to see in the library. These are their responses;

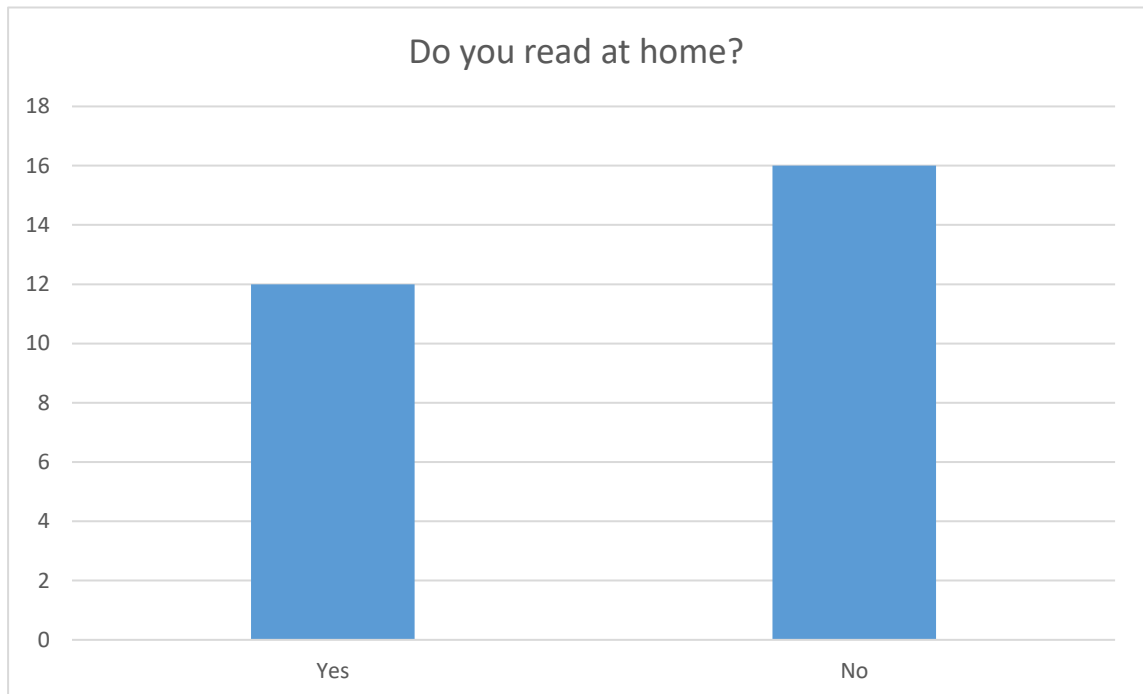

There is 1-1 accelerated reader time for KS3 and Yr 10. There is a phonics scheme for the nurture groups to help with their reading.

Most pupils do not read at home. We are addressing this through SLT and staff meetings to look at reading for homework, rewards and incentives using Accelerated Reader to give quizzes and count word

9. We then asked pupils if they could think of any improvements towards our reading culture. These are the responses;

*'Read more often than once a week'*

*'I like it the way it is'*

*'Add another 10 minutes to reading'*

*'I would prefer to do reading in the afternoon rather than in the morning'*

*'Don't force people to read, just ask if they want to'*

*'Yes there needs to be a room for reading and the back of the room is a little townstock image'*

*'Audible books would be good available on Alexa'*
